A Community Concern

The closure of the Social and Rehabilitative Services (SRS) offices in Lawrence will have a devastating impact on our community. This proposed action has been a prime topic of conversation, and as people of faith who follow Jesus' command to care for the poor, it is of vital concern to us. If there is no reconsideration of this action every church, synagogue and mosque in Lawrence will need to sharply increase their benevolence towards those who had been faithfully served by the 87 workers in the SRS office.

Valarie Miller-Coleman, director of the Family Promise Program, outlined the breadth of the problem in this way in her July Newsletter:

- Nearly ten percent of the population of Douglas County will be directly impacted.
- More than 1,200 people receive Temporary Assistance for Families - a small cash supplement for families with children living without any other source of income.
- 400 households receive Child Care Assistance - a subsidy to pay a portion of child care expenses for low income families.

Perhaps more significantly, those in need will lose valuable face-to-face connection with professional social workers who are their support network. For example, each client or family meets with a case worker who follows their case and prepares necessary forms pertaining to their needs. After an initial in-person visit, families remain in contact by phone, but that often proves difficult given the high case loads of each case manager. Just imagine how much more difficult this will become when a family without transportation is required to travel to Ottawa, Overland Park or Topeka, to receive assistance. And while the SRS Secretary suggests that needs can be met through the internet, most cases require hard documents to process the benefits applications, which cannot be done without a physical visit to the SRS office.

The Church in Africa:

One Shining Example of Ecumenical Cooperation

August 28 bobbie-frances mcdonald shares her thoughts on what challenges the Republic of South Sudan (RSS) faces and what this separation from the north means for those Christians left behind. On July 9, 2011 South Sudan became the 193rd country in the world and the 55th country in Africa. Despite a battered past and little infrastructure, this new nation has this strength: an active church. This is a one-day class and will be held in the Fireside Room during the regular Sunday school time.

September 11, Classes begin

Earl Huyser's class offers his first lessons with the examination of the United Monarchy, a unique time in the history of the Israelites. This period involves many of the most memo-

rable stories and personalities found in the Old Testament. Two accounts of this period, which lasted for only about one century, are found in the Deuteronomic Histories, I and II Samuel and I and II Kings, and then again in I and II Chronicles. An examination of the events during the reigns of Kings Saul, David and Solomon is reflective of the development of the religion of the Israelites in the periods of their history when these Old Testament books were written. The class meets at 9:40 in the Chapel.

Feasting on the Word

Beginning September 11, Pastor Mary is leading a class entitled "*Feasting on the Word*," a curriculum produced by PCUSA which follows the lectionary used by our pastors in preparing their sermons each Sunday. Scriptures from the book of Matthew will be followed and studied each week up to Advent (November 27). This class meets in the Fireside Conference Room at 9:40 a.m. each Sunday. We invite you to come to all or as many of these classes as you are able to attend.

Book Study

"Eternal Life: A New Vision of Eternity," by John Shelby Spong. This is Spong's latest book. He writes about his understandings of what it means to go beyond religion, beyond theism and beyond heaven and hell as he looks at what it means to have eternal life. Spong puts emphasis on scientific method and the discoveries it yields to answer his questions. Dee Link will lead discussions in north Fellowship Hall at 9:40 a.m.

Books will be available ahead of September 11 in the church office, so those who have signed up can begin reading. Books are (\$15 ea.) **Let the office know if you want a book, by August 15.**

MyPlate and What is a Serving of Fruits and Vegetables?

Fill Half Your Plate!

Making It Simple: The Half-Your-Plate Concept.

What does a serving of broccoli look like? How many baby carrots are in a cup? Even the most well-versed nutrition professionals don't have all these measurements memorized! So let's make it easier: fill half your plate with fruits and vegetables at each meal or eating occasion.



Making fruits and vegetables the focal point of every meal will help you meet your recommended amount each day—and you won't have to do all the math!

The new healthy **MyPlate** icon developed by the USDA supports this concept—fill half your plate with colorful fruits and vegetables at every meal!

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) have released the new Dietary Guidelines for Americans with no changes to the recommended fruit and vegetable servings per day. The new guidelines do, however, stress the move to a more plant-based diet, specifically instructing Americans to fill half their plates with fruits and vegetables. They also emphasize limiting added sugars and solid fats in the diet, and slashed the maximum recommendation for sodium from less

than 2,300 mg to 1,500 mg per day. The new dietary guidelines policy document points out that most Americans of all ages consume too few fruits and vegetables and too many added sugars and solid fats.

Every five (5) years, USDA and HHS examine the latest developments in nutritional science and release a new version of their Dietary Guidelines for Americans. This is done to keep them current with new developments in nutritional science. The guidelines serve as the basis for federal food and nutrition programs like the USDA school breakfast and lunch programs.

The Fruits & Veggies-More Matters website also suggests filling half your plate with fruits and vegetables at every meal or snack as a way of simplifying the process of making sure you're eating enough. The site, **www.fruitsandveggiesmorematters.org**, offers tips, recipes, videos, and lots of other helpful information to help ensure half of your plate is fruits and vegetables.
