Epiphany Stars – In 2025 we started a new beginning to a new year. Epiphany star words are a modern spiritual practice where people choose a single word, often on a paper star, to guide them through the year, inspired by the Magi following the star to Jesus. This tradition links to the biblical story of the wise men's journey, symbolizing trust, divine guidance, and discovery, allowing individuals to reflect on how God moves in their lives through their chosen word (like "Share," "Trust," or "Generosity") throughout the year. We will have star words available for you to choose at random (they will be upside down in a basket – let the word be a surprise, not something you choose). This is a great time to reflect on how your Star Word for 2025 was significant in the year and how you see 2026 shaping up! If you miss picking one up on Sunday, they will be available in the Church Office until they run out.



The Deacon Love Fund has been busy in December. A decision was made to move some of the Mission Committee support for the Lawrence Ministerial Emergency Fund to the FPC Deacon Love Fund making some additional options available to assist our friends and neighbors facing challenging times. In December the fund provided over \$2000 in rent and utility assistance for 15 individuals or families. We expect that housing is going to become more challenging for some in 2026 as some of the assistance funding is no longer available. This is a place where we can help fill in the gaps for our friends who need a few extra dollars that we might have available. Please prayerfully consider a gift to the Love Fund!

FPC has Medical Equipment to share! In December we loaned eight items to folks who were mostly having surgery of some kind. We also had 16 items returned from folks who are finished using them and wanted someone else to have the opportunity to borrow something. We have walkers, toilet risers, canes, peddlers, bath chairs, transfer benches, knee braces, crutches and commodes, to name a few. If you are in need or know someone who is, be sure to let them know this service is available. These items are expensive to purchase – especially for only a short time! Thanks for getting the word out. We also accept most donations.

New Year Clean Out! Often the new year brings cleaning out closets, basements, and drawers with plans for new or just clearing out the "extras" we no longer need. Our families in Family Promise Lawrence might be very happy to receive some of these items and hope you will keep them in mind as you go through your closets! Some things they are looking for include: Queen size metal platform bed frames (that don't need box springs), AA batteries, small tool kits with basic tools, laundry baskets and hampers, frying pan sets, silverware, bakeware, disposable Tupperware, Swiffer mopping sheets, both wet and dry.
