What do you know about Haskell Indian Nations University (HINU)?



Today, Haskell Indian Nation University is a focal point of the Lawrence Native community. As the de facto national tribal college, its student body is regularly composed of citizens from over 100 Native Nations, and Lawrence boasts a sizable Native population. Therefore, as an institution rooted in faith, local communities, and history, First Presbyterian Church fully acknowledges and celebrates the native cultures and organizations that make Lawrence stronger. Furthermore, we recognize the experiences of Native people in our own community and elsewhere in an effort to heal and bring forth a brighter tomorrow.

New Documentary from PDA – The most recent documentary from Presbyterian Disaster Assistance is called "Evicting the American Dream" and is now available on Amazon Prime. In a compelling way, this film amplifies the voices and stories of children and families confronting eviction and homelessness. Through interviews with pediatric psychologists, social workers, tenant rights organizations, housing authority officials, and eviction lawyers, this film explores the root causes and systemic issues that perpetuate this epidemic and ways in which it is preventable.
