This used to be done by the "Muggers" who delivered information about us and a FPC mug. When we ran out of mugs, we decided to change to delivering a bag, and the name was changed to the "Bag Brigade". A "Bagger" is contacted by the office if a delivery is needed in the week they volunteered to deliver. The office organizes the Bag and the delivery information for the Bagger. The Bagger then

welcomes a new guest with a Bag with information about our programs. It is as easy as that. This is a volunteer opportunity that does not require heavy lifting, cooking, gardening, cleaning or committee meetings! Join our Bag Brigade! We can also provide a Bag for pick up if they provide an email address. Thank you!

We also had 16 items returned from folks who are finished using them and wanted someone else to have the opportunity to borrow something. We have walkers, toilet risers, canes, peddlers, bath chairs, transfer benches, knee braces, crutches and commodes, to name a few. Family Promise News Many things are happening in Family Promise these days. FPC has just completed their host week with Connect Church. Our youth made Stuffed Shells, Salad, and Brownies for our Family Promise dinner on Sunday, January 4th. Eva Alley, Jan Roth, and Lois Dutcher hosted seven adults, 1 youth (14 years old), 5 children (5-6 years old), and 5 children (1 year and under). Nearly a full house at Mount Hope! FPC also provided \$100 worth of toilet paper, paper towels, garbage bags, and all-purpose cleanser. Thank you to all who helped in any way and especially to our youth! They loved all of your offerings.

FPC and the Matthew 25 Cohort is a proud sponsor of the showing of the movie **"Sugarcane"** on January 25 at the Unitarian Universalist Congregation located at 1263 N. 1100 Rd. Peace Mennonite Church is co-hosting the event with UUC. The screening is free and open to everyone.

The screening is part of the Sugarcane Faith Community Screening Tour, which offers the free screening to communities of faith to support conversations around truth and reconciliation. The goal of this program is to encourage Christians and other faith groups to engage in discussions focused on shared understanding, courage, and repair. The tour is sponsored by Land Justice futures and partnered by the Coalition to dismantle the Doctrine of Discovery. The movie is rated "R". If inclement weather occurs, the event will be cancelled.

"Human Needs are Human Rights" was the theme of this year's rally at the Capitol led by Kansas Interfaith Action held this past Wednesday. FPC was represented by Margie Dyck, Henry Johns, Anna Shouse, Dave Kyner, Linda Watts, Cynthia Meyer, and Thad Holcombe.

Rabbi Moti Rieber, executive director of Kansas Interfaith Action, which helped organize the rally, told the crowd, "We are living in troubling times. America is showing its dark underbelly." Rieber and other speakers addressed food insecurity, voting rights, climate change, health care, reproductive rights, public education, and immigration enforcement — themes that also appeared on handwritten signs throughout the crowd.
