A Call to put Our "Faith into Action" - HB 2238 which bans the participation of transgender children in sports will soon be on Governor Kelly's desk to sign into law. There are only 2 identified students in the state that this law will affect. But protecting students is not the reason for the law. During the monthly Kansas Interfaith Alliance (KIFA) advocates meeting Rabbi Moti Rieber, KIFA executive director summed it up this way. These legislators are following the Nazi playbook of coming for small minorities first. If we don't take notice and push back it won't be long before they will be lining up the buses for everyone else who doesn't fit into their vision of a white America.

Governor Kelly is expected to veto the bill. Hopefully there will be enough legislators to prevent the Republican supermajority from overriding her veto. But another bill will be introduced next year. We worship with transgender people every Sunday. They are valued members of our congregation. We must stand up for them and say this is unacceptable. Use this <u>link</u> to send a letter of support to Governor Kelly now. Rabi Moti is encouraging us to let her know that **as persons of faith and a faith community** we oppose this bill because it directly contradicts Christ's teachings.
