Matthew 25 information for you – Coming Together to Address Hunger in Our Community - Just Food is putting together a collaborative effort in Lawrence to address the pending and continuing crisis of food insecurity. With the unstable funding provided by the SNAP program, families, children, the elderly, and disabled are facing a dire emergency of food access. Data shows that for 2024, in Douglas County, an average of 4,832 individuals received SNAP benefits. FPC has been a long-time partner with Just Food, contributing food and volunteers. Please consider making a donation or volunteering your assistance. Monetary donations are recommended by Just Food as they are able to purchase food at a lower price, getting more "bang for the buck". The online fundraiser through the Douglas County Community Foundation is now available at this link. As part of the plan, community members can also sign up to volunteer to help through United Way of Kaw Valley.

Willow Domestic Violence Center – The Willow builds safer communities through shelter, services, and support for survivors of domestic violence and human trafficking in Douglas, Franklin, and Jefferson counties in Kansas. In addition to your gifts through the Special Christmas Giving, they are in need of gift cards to popular places with common goods, food, or gasoline, such as Walmart, Target, Dillons, QT, and Casey's. These gift cards are the most low-barrier, trauma-informed way we can help meet the needs of survivors. They are also currently out of, or running low on, the following:

Face wash and lotion, Body wash and lotion, shampoo and conditioner, textured hair products, baby wipes, hair gel, mousse, spray, razors, baby wash and lotion, cleaning products, laundry soap pods, tampons, deodorant, Tylenol, Ibuprofen, cold and flu medicine.

Please note that they can NOT accept:

Clothes, shoes, used bedding, electronics, furniture, baby accessories, used toys and stuffed animals, travel-sized toiletries, books, or opened hygiene items.

Please consider the Ballard Center, Community Children's Center, Clare's Community Closet, and Lawrence Community Shelter for those items not accepted at Willow.
