An Opportunity to Express Gratitude for Medicaid Expansion Efforts

Last week the KS Senate voted to move the Medicaid expansion bill (SB355) out of the Public Health and Safety Committee. The motion failed by just 6 votes signaling the end of this year's push for Medicaid Expansion. But we have reasons to be optimistic. More than 900 pieces of written testimony were submitted in support of Medicaid expansion and thousands of supportive emails and postcards were delivered to lawmakers. The pressure we placed on legislators resulted in hearings in both the House and Senate and our combined voice was loud enough to force a conversation that had been avoided for years. Hopefully momentum will continue to grow, and lawmakers will hold a full and transparent debate and pass Medicaid expansion in the 2025 session.

Please consider sending an email thanking the Republican Senators who voted yes to move the bill out of committee. Their names and email addresses are listed below. Many of them experienced significant pressure from their party to vote against the motion. We want them to know how much it was appreciated. Please thank the amazing Democratic senators who supported and pushed for the bill.
