PC(USA) delegation begins to right a historic wrong in Juneau, Alaska. The Session of First Presbyterian Church of Lawrence urged the Presbytery of Northern Kansas to support an overture to the General Assembly with was ultimately approved to admit our responsibility for the racist closure of a church in Juneau, Alaska in 1963. In a very moving video that includes an admission of the Presbyterian Church (USA) taking responsibility. This action and our support of it speaks to our commitment to being a Matthew 25 Congregation and understanding that an apology needs reparation.  - The Affordable Housing Trust Fund with over 800 units created to date.
 - o No jail expansion while pushing for Criminal Justice Reform.
 - o The Mental Health Treatment and Recovery Center was built and is operational.
 - Restorative Practice Teams in every school AND there is a three-year funding source.
