Lenten Theme: Jesus' words are easily distorted and sanitized in our modern world. Following Jesus leads to a richer, more expansive life, but it's not necessarily comfortable. Jesus' ministry can be described as "radical" which comes from the Latin word "radicalis," meaning "root" or "ground." Therefore, the good news should bring us back to our roots. Emulating Jesus and embodying his teachings should ground us in who God created us to be. Can we be "good news" people in a world too often burdened by bad news? This Lent we will focus on what was central to Jesus' life and ministry: radical welcome, love for neighbor, care for the vulnerable, nourishment for the hungry, nonviolence in the face of injustice. At the heart of Jesus' teachings, we find liberation, love, mercy, and grace—all of which are meant to be very good news for us all.

Ash Wednesday Services are the beginning of Lent and will be held on February 18th from 12:30 to 1:30 and 6:00 to 7:00 in the Chapel. This experiential service will help us focus on the Season of Lent which starts this year with an invitation to come and join us because we all want to be invited! Everyone is welcome to this come and go service. Our theme for Lent is "Tell Me Something Good". Let's start off the Lenten season by grounding ourselves in the good news and inviting someone to share in that news with us.
